Russell Museum / Te Whare Taonga o Kororareka offers an opportunity for New Zealand artists who whakapapa to Nga Puhi and Northland hapu to exhibit art works which explore, address, investigate or create dialogue on the Nga Puhi Treaty Claims.

Selection will be based on:

- 1) art work showing a high professional level
- 2) consideration of images and accompanying explanation of work(s) submitted for exhibition, any accompanying set up plans, along with an artist statement & bio
- 3) the artist' connection to Nga Puhi iwi and/or Northland hapu

Artists are encouraged to submit traditional, modern, post modern, installation, recontextualised, visual, digital, performance and audio-visual works for consideration. The opportunity to sell your work during the exhibition is available.
