DEPARTMENT OF CONSERVATION

Includes a 12-minute AV show on the history of the Bay of Islands. Presentations by DOC rangers on: marine mammals, Kororareka/Russell history through archaeological digs and general conservation issues. RUSSELL MUSEUM

The Russell Museum tells the story of its township, recording the earliest years of Mäori/European contact, including a 1:5 scale model of Cook's Endeavour. There are also artefacts relating to the town's 100 years as a port of call for whaling ships. A 12-minute video outlines the town's history. The Museum sells Heritage Trail booklets to encourage visitors to explore the town and its vicinity. The shop specialises in Northland books and souvenirs from the area.

An authentically designed 19th C gaff rigged tops'l schooner, a beautiful working ship steeped in rugged tradition yet modern and safe. The ship will take students from Russell back to Opua. Students can help set the sails, take the helm, put on harnesses to climb the rigging and go out onto the bowsprit under crew guidance. Crew will fire the cannon during the voyage as well.
